Kia Ora Parents and Whanau

Welcome back to the 2025 school year.

There are lots of beginning of the year activities planned for both students and whānau.

The annual **Riversdale Prime Lamb and Calf Competition** is being held tomorrow, 14th February, at the showgrounds from 6pm onwards. This team very generously donate money to our school - for which we are very appreciative. This year the school group is cooking the BBQ, if you are able to pop along and help us please let the office know.

On **Monday 17th February at 10am we are having a Mihi Whakatau** (welcome celebration) for our new students and staff. All school families are invited to join us in this welcome celebration.

On **Tuesday 18th February parents and children are invited to a Meet the Teachers** evening from 6-7pm. This is an informal way to meet your child's teacher and find out more about the classroom expectations and timetable. You can come any time from 6-7pm and stay as long or short a time as you like. If you want to have a one on one interview with your child's teacher you can always make an appointment with their teacher for another time.

The **Waimea Plains Athletics Day is on Thursday 27th of February** at the Riversdale Showgrounds. On this day we join with Waikaia and Balfour Schools. More information about this will come out next week.

On **Sunday 23rd February at 9am** we will be meeting at the grounds to get them ready for Thursday. We need some extra helpers to mark lines and mow tracks. If you are able to come along, bring a lawn mower and help out we would really appreciate the support. Please let the office know. The more people we have the quicker we can get the job finished.

This year we are fully introducing a programme called *Play Is The Way*. The classes had a trial look at the programme in Term 4 last year and the teachers were keen to explore it more. All staff

have been involved in a training day and now we are ready to fully implement it throughout the school.

The objectives of the programme are

- To develop independent, self-managing, self-motivated, empathetic children of good character
- To help staff, students and parents create a safe learning environment in which students learn to be independent, self-regulating, self-motivated learners in persistent pursuit of their personal best and able to get along with each other
- To develop students who are considerate of themselves, each other and the world in which they live with sound and good reasons for the things they say and do.

The programme is based around 5 "Life Rafts" and we will be looking at all of them over time. If you look below you will find an overview of each of the concepts being covered. At the moment we are working on the Golden Rule



Ask your children about the discussions they are having in their classes about this. If you would like to find out more about the programme, we have organised our facilitator, Marlene Campbell, to come and run a parents evening on Tuesday the 11th March from 6-7:30pm. More details will come out closer to the event. Or we have several copies of a book called *Children Aren't Made Of China* by Wilson McCaskill available for parents to borrow. It is an easy read and gives background to why this programme was developed. If you would like to borrow a copy give us a call.

Just a reminder that in Term 1 sun hats are to be worn when outside. The sun hats must have a brim all the way around (a cap style hat is not acceptable). The Home and School are doing an order for school sun hats; look back on the Hero posts from this week for ordering and payment details, by the 18th of February. No sun hat = playing under the big tree.

School safety vests are to be worn to and from school daily, even if students are being picked up at the gate. If your child has lost their vest the Home and School have some available to purchase for \$10 at the office (cash only). No vest = rubbish duty at morning tea time (gloves will be provided).

Cell phones are not to be used at school by students. If your child needs to bring their phone to school because of after school activities it is to be either tucked safely in their bag all day and not brought out, or handed into the office each morning.

A number of students bring toys from home to play with at lunchtimes, and while this is fun they can get damaged or lost at times. If it is a precious toy please leave it at home. We take no responsibility for any lost or damaged items from home.

Please ensure that absences and early pickups are communicated to the school in a timely manner to avoid any confusion. If your child/ren are absent, notify the school via the Hero App or text the school mobile and make sure to include the reason of absence. For early pickups either send a note with your child in the morning or text/ring the school prior to arriving.

As always if you have any concerns regarding your child at school please contact your child's teacher in the first instance. If the matter needs further discussion then the principal will be brought into the conversation. We want to partner with you in your child's education, when we can talk about small things and resolve them we can stop big situations or issues from happening.
